

2023-24 Will Bring Exciting Changes

New Nursing Curriculum

The College has been hard at work this past year preparing significant changes for the future. The Nursing Department is putting the final changes to the new BSN curriculum that will roll out this upcoming fall. The current curriculum has been in place since the inception of the BSN program in 2016 and has served hundreds of nursing students over the last seven years.

Connie McFadden-Chase ('94), Vice President and Chief Academic Officer, stated, "the revised BSN curriculum is a positive shift that provides an opportunity to incorporate the new American Association Colleges of Nursing (AACN) Essentials and align coursework, clinical, and assessments to the competencies required of today's nurse. Gail Burns, Associate Professor of Nursing and significant contributor to the team tasked with updating the curriculum, noted that the new curriculum "will promote greater success on both NCLEX-RN and transition to practice."

- specialty nursing courses.











New Strategic Plan

Another significant change that will be implemented this year is the roll out of a new strategic plan. The current plan, ending this summer, focused on fostering adaptability in students, developing leaders, aligning coursework to student's passion and purpose, and enhancing both scholarly and financial development of the College. The new plan, currently being drafted, will be presented to the Board of Directors in July with a final plan to approved in October and implemented in January 2024.

After nursing, Thelma continued her love and dedication for helping people and serving others via numerous volunteer activities within retirement centers and other service organizations.

As evidenced by the "PROUD GRADUATE" message found as a barely-still-legible portion of one of her two engraved bricks located in the College's memory walk, Thelma was a proud and active graduate of the College, including service as a 1945 class agent and as a committee member for The Elizabeth Dumm Memorial Scholarship.

Even well into retirement, Thelma was always a proud nurse ready to pass along a teaching moment when needed. Like during times when she was hospitalized and would correct a hospital nurse's errant greeting of "I understand that you used to be a nurse" with a polite, yet determined "No, I AM a nurse."
