The Christ College of Nursing & Health Sciences' president, Gail Kist-Kline, Ph.D., concluded her professional education career after 40 years of service on December 31st. For the last six years, Gail has led TCCNHS through a period of challenges and continued growth.

Among these successes are the addition of programs including the Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Associate of Applied Science in Diagnostic Medical Sonography, and Medical Assisting Clinical Certificate programs. Under her leadership, the college has implemented a new Career Pathways Program, allowing students to earn pay and experience at the Christ Hospital alongside their studies. She has built solid relationships with The Christ Hospital Health Network, creating a pipeline for talent to give our students the best educational and career opportunities. She has proven financial sustainability and growth by securing grants to support student scholarships, such as the Choose Ohio First Grant through the Ohio Department of Education. A new building, The Christ College Commons, was opened to support student learning in the health sciences, and the main campus's Den and Study underwent facelifts. She navigated a global pandemic, managed the shift to online learning, and celebrated Quality Matters Certification for many of our online courses. She has created Board policy process, implemented new curriculum to create faster pathways to degrees, and has developed high potential leaders to assure stability and growth well into the future. Named several times to the TOP 300 list of influential leaders in Cincinnati, Dr. Kist-Kline has earned her retirement!

Dr. Wendel joined Mt. Auburn Ob-Gyn Assoc., Inc. in 1986 and is currently the managing partner for the group. He has served as President of The Christ Hospital Medical Staff, is a past member of The Christ Hospital Board of Trustees and served as President of the

Organization of the Physicians & Surgeons Assurance Company, and as a board member of the ExCel Insurance Company Ltd.
